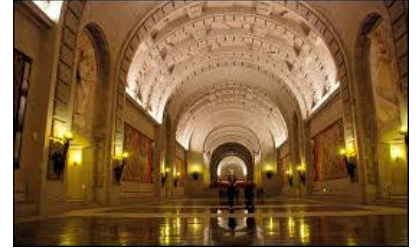

"History of Legends of Spain"

Our adventure in Spain begins in Madrid, where we visit many historic sites. First on the list the "Valley of the Fallen" plus a tour of the Basilica De La Santa Cruz, the El Escorial Monastery and the Royal Palace of El Pardo. Spain has a rich history dating back to the times of Christ when it was part of the Roman Empire. Later on, the Moors controlled Spain for 400 years. The influence of the Romans and Moors was most evident in touring many cities and in this beautiful country. Our educational adventure now takes us to the walled city of Toledo. Here we visit San Domingo De Silos, where El Greco spent many years painting hundreds of magnificent masterpieces in this church. We also tour the Toledo Cathedral which once was a mosque. Traveling the countryside we see olive groves, fields of cotton and wheat, also some of the 8,000



abandoned castles. What a surprise to see Don Quixote, in full armor, ready to attack the windmills at Consuegra. On the way to Granada we stop to see the 800 mile long Segovia Aqueduct built by the Romans in 90 A.D. This is also Spanish wine country, 3rd largest producer in the world. There are

many bull ranches to service the bull rings of Spain. At Granada, we visit the Alhambra Palace and the Royal Chapel.



Surprisingly, Spain has ski lodges in the Sierra Nevada Mountain near Granada. Next we visit the Costa del Sol region on the Spanish Rivera. There are miles and miles of sunny beaches and resort hotels, all the way to Marbella. At Marbella we see where the "Jet Set" play and live in super luxurious homes, on a 4 mile stretch of beaches, called "the Golden Mile." Next, we enter the British territory at the Rock of Gibraltar



and venture into the WWII tunnels and natural caverns of the Rock. The Grand Cavern is now a concert hall providing a venue for Operas, Philharmonic Orchestras and beauty pageants. While on the Rock we are warned of Macaques Apes that look for fruit and snacks in your pockets. On our way to Seville we again stay at another 5 Star Hotel and enjoy a Flamenco Dance Show, visit the Bull Ring and surgical unit. Also we

tour the Royal Palace of Seville and the Royal Cathedral. This seven hundred year old Cathedral was originally built by the Moors. Christopher Columbus and many of the Royal families are buried here. Cordoba was once the most populated city in the world and here we visit the Mosque of the Caliphs. Our adventure ends after one of many evening dining experiences under the stars.



We fly out of the Madrid Airport following 911 and seeing the smoke as we fly over the World Trade Center. This is a 70 minute lecture and visual presentation.
